Yale-New Haven Hospital Newborn Special Care Unit

As a licensed 46-bed Level III-C Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, the Newborn Special Care Unit (NBSCU) at Yale-New Haven Hospital offers registered nurses an extraordinary opportunity to practice in one of the premier neonatal settings in the northeast.

The NBSCU serves as a local, regional and international referral center for the care of extremely premature as well as term infants with a variety of medical and surgical life-threatening illnesses. Our nursing team works within a multidisciplinary setting to provide care in both critical care areas, as well as for the acute care population. Advanced care modalities such as ECMO, Nitric Oxide and Oscillator therapies are offered for the most critical population of infants. In the acute care setting, nurses are involved in all aspects of the planning and family preparation for a smooth transition from hospital to home.

Here you will find a large and experienced staff whose hallmark through the years has been a profound commitment to providing excellent comprehensive, compassionate family-centered care utilizing a Primary Care model.

Our unit provides an environment that allows each nurse the opportunity to grow both personally and professionally. RNs on the Newborn Special Care Unit are encouraged to participate in clinical/unit-based committees, and to be involved in hospital-wide improvement programs. Our staff participates in unit-based advanced training – such as the All-Nurse Transport Team – and enjoys a structured Clinical Ladder designed to facilitate their professional growth. A strong emphasis on nurses with leaders is enhanced through a Nurse Residency program for new RNs, and a Triage Role within the unit for RNs with experience within the NBSCU.

New graduate nurses are strongly encouraged to apply, as we offer a structured orientation program which centers on professional development.
